92-Year-Old Twins Awarded French Legion of Honor

t's been more than 70 years since retired Air Force Reserve Majors Raymond "Glenn" Clanin and Russell "Lynn" Clanin served as pilots during World War II. But just this past December the brothers were awarded the French government's highest distinction as a veteran, The Legion of Honor medal.

The Clanins both flew the B-26 Marauder nicknamed Flak-bait with the 449th Bombardment Squadron while stationed in Beauvais, France. Glenn flew 26 missions in the twin-engine bomber while his brother flew 21 missions.

During the ceremony Christophe Lemoine, the French general consul in Los Angeles, thanked the brothers for their role in restoring France's freedom.

"You are an inspiration to us all and to the younger generations. ... On behalf of the French government, as well as on behalf of the people of France, I would like to tell you very sincerely, from the bottom of my heart, thank you. Thank you for your heroism and your sacrifice," said Lemoine.

This past December, thanks to declassification of the mission details, the two men were finally honored with Silver Stars for their rescue of an Army Special Forces patrol in Duc Lap on Feb. 20, 1969.

"It is incredibly important, finally, that we have the opportunity to thank you," said Air Force Chief of Staff Gen. Mark Welsh during the ceremony.




